Nursery Funding

- Parent Authorisation Forms your child cannot start with us unless we have received the completed funding eform.
- This allows us to claim funding on your behalf for the universal 15 hours or extended 30 hours funding.
- If you are self funding the additional 15 hours of a 30 hour place, you will need to pay the fees before 11th July. You will have received your invoice in June. Please pay ASAP before the deadline
- If your child has a 30 hour place, you will either need to pay for the extra hour or pick your child up at 2.30pm. Fees are due half termly in advance and the fees for Autumn 1 must be paid by 11th July. Invoices for this extra hour have also been sent out in June. Please pay ASAP.
- If you wish to transfer your entitlement to a different provider you must give four weeks' written notice to your existing provider. Your child will not be able to access their early education entitlement at a new provider until the week following the end of the four week notice period.

Starting School – preparation

Preparation is key...

- Your child has been on their potty adventure and your child can manage their toileting needs independently.
- Attend the Stay and Play session in September so your child feels comfortable in the school environment and begins to get to know the Nursery team.
- A home visit helps to develop the parent partnership with the school.
- Look at the school uniform together and get your child to try on their school uniform and practise getting ready for school.
- Promote independence at home.



Play based learning

- Follow the children's interests
- Work closely with home
- Staff role is to support the children and teach in the moment
- Long periods of uninterrupted play Play is meaningful experience for children.







Starting Nursery – a quick goodbye...

- Home visit A great opportunity to share information about your child
- On the way to school, talk to your child about all the exciting learning they will be doing...'I wonder if the dinosaurs will be out today.', 'Mrs Newman may have made some glittery play dough', 'I wish I could play in the mud kitchen outside!'
- Drop off with a smile. Assure them that they will have fun at school, learning new things. If you
 look worried or anxious it could make your child feel unsure about the situation be the best
 actor you can be!
- If your child is upset, it is helpful to remind them of what they will do after school going to the park. Saying this in front of the teacher/teaching assistant will also help them to talk to your child about what they have to look forward to, 'I heard you are going to the park after school. I love the swings, what is your favourite thing at the park?' This helps to distract your child and gives them something exciting to focus on.



Snack and Lunch (30 hours provision)

- Your child will need a packed lunch:
- No fizzy drinks
- Nut free as we are a nut aware school
- No chocolate or sweets
- Your child needs to manage their lunch independently (we can support a little bit)
- The children will eat their lunch in the Nursery supported by two SMSA's. They will have 1 hour for lunch. Once they have eaten they will go outside for a play in the garden.
- Snack time for AM and PM Nursery:
- Cool milk
- Fruit

Uniform

At HISN we have high expectations for our appearance and take pride in our school uniform. We believe it builds a sense of belonging to our school and we are extremely proud of the image portrayed by children wearing our school uniform in the local community.

Children are not allowed to wear jewellery such as necklaces or bracelets (unless required for medical or religious reasons) but can wear a single pair of simple stud earrings which must be removed at home before PE/Games lessons.

Long hair should be tied back at all times whilst at school and for PE/Games.

- Headbands must be plain and simple without excessive decoration.
- Bows worn in the hair should be small and either green, red or black.
- Religious headdress for religious observance including Hijab, Patka and Kippah should be either green, red or black.
- Nail varnish and temporary tattoos are not permitted in school.
- Black shoes should be worn during the school day.
- Open toed shoes/sandals are NOT acceptable due to health and safety considerations.



Uniform

The children are required to wear the following uniform:

'Uniform' at Hampton Infants...

Learning starts at home...

Here are some activities you can try with your child between now and September...

- Reading and share as many books with your child as you can we want them to have a love of reading and to understand how to talk about stories. Join the local library and go along to story sessions – this will help your child get used to sitting with others and listening to an adult for 5 – 10 minutes.
- Listen to music and recite nursery rhymes this will help your child to develop their listening skills and also their ability to hear rhyming words (links to reading and writing).
- Talk, talk and talk. Ask your child questions when you are out and about. What can they see? Hear? Smell? What is the smallest/biggest thing they can see? Encourage curiosity.
- Go to the park, walk in the woods, play in the back garden explore different textures, smells and sights.

Class Pet Diaries

- 1 class pet for AM Nursery and 1 for PM Nursery.
- Every week, 1 child from the nursery will take a pet and the diary home.
- Please read the story with your child and the class teddy and fill in a book review and send it back.
- You can add a photo to tapestry if you would like to no pressure!

- Story book to share together at home
- Reading record please sign to acknowledge you have shared the book at home
- Please send your book back every week
