

Maths:

- We will be learning about length and height using language such as long, short, tall etc.
- We will be learning about weight and making comparisons with objects using heavier than and lighter than.
- We will be exploring capacity e.g. full, empty.
- We will continue to explore shapes and how they feature in the world around us.
- We will continue to confidently recognise and name numbers 1 to 10.
- We will continue to explore the use of positional language e.g., on top of.
- We are consolidating our understanding and use of mathematical language to compare and problem solve. We investigate what is the same and what is different.

Literacy:

- We will be learning to identify our name by looking for the initial letter.
- We will be learning to hold a pencil using the correct grip.
- We will be learning to recall key parts of a familiar story.
- We will be learning to write our name.

Communication and Language:

- We will continue to enjoy reading and singing songs.
- We will be learning how to be a good speaker and listener; using our Talk partners.
- We will begin to understand why and how questions.
- We will be learning to speak in full sentences showing an awareness of the listener.

Physical Development:

- We will be talking about how to keep our bodies healthy and how to stay safe when we exercise.
- We will be learning to travel with confidence and skill around, under, over and through equipment.
- We will be learning to keep ourselves safe during outdoor learning and when using equipment in the classroom.
- We will be continuing to strengthen the muscles in our hands ready for writing.
- We will be beginning to form some letters.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

- We will be sharing our weekend news in a whole group situation, taking it in turns to talk and demonstrating good listening skills too.
- We will be continuing to develop our friendships as well as our turn taking skills.
- We will be learning to become more independent and responsible for our belongings, including getting ready for home time.

Understanding the World:

- We will be learning about the world around us, including habitats.
- We will be learning how to stay safe when playing outside in the sun.
- We will be learning about what a plant needs to grow and stay healthy and how we can take care of our environment.
- We will be learning about some of the things that make us unique.

Expressive Arts and Design:

- We will be learning what colours we can mix to create new colours.
- We will be exploring a variety of materials to create our own models and pictures.
- We will continue to explore rhyme through learning a variety of songs as well as through stories and simple poems.
- We will become confident to sing in singing assemblies.

Supporting your child at home:

- Support your child with their listening skills at home. Share a story or sing a song together and stop – asking your child to finish the song or story.
- Enjoy reading and singing together at home.
- Give your child jobs to complete around the home to help develop their listening skills and independence e.g., putting lids back on pens.
- Encourage your child to hold a pen/pencil and draw letters, numbers or simply make marks on a page. Ask your child what they have written or drawn for you as every mark has a meaning for your child.
