Geography: How can we compare and contrast the 4 countries in the United Kingdom?

Pupils will learn about the different regions within the UK, the topographical features, how the land has changed over time. Pupils will also investigate why might people choose to visit or live in the UK and how trade and the economies compare in the capital cities.

History: Have the crimes and their punishments changed throughout time?

Pupils will learn about modern crime and punishment and compare this to the Roman Empire, the Viking Era, the Middle Ages, the Tudor Era and the Victorian Era.

RE: Why do some people believe in God and some not?

Pupils will be learning about how people label their beliefs, if people say they believe in God do they all mean the same thing and why does belonging matter more than proof.
