Money: Combining amounts of money, adding and subtracting money, giving change, giving amounts of money in £ and p

Lengths: Measure, compare add and subtract lengths (m, cm, mm)

Mass and capacity: measure, compare, add and subtract mass (g/kg) and volume/capacity (l/ml)

Time: telling the time to the nearest minute from an analogue clock, including using Roman numerals from I to XII, telling the time from 12-hour and 24-hour clocks, record and compare time, know the number of seconds in a minute and number of days in each month, year and leap year, compare durations of events

Shape- draw 2D shapes and make 3D shapes, recognise angles, identify right angles, horizontal and vertical lines.
