The carefully designed nursery will provide the children with a sensory room, experiences garden, small group teaching spaces as well as free flow access to outdoor learning opportunities.




IMPORTANT INFORMATION



DROP OF AND PICK UP

Please ensure children are dropped off and collected when the gates are open.

If your child is a late arrival bring them in to school via the office.

Children must not be left at the gate to walk to the office themselves, they must be accompanied by an adult; the adult must sign the child in on the school system located at the office reception







NURSERY



Stories are a huge part of our curriculum at Nursery and each week the children immerse themselves in our focus texts. A recent favourite was 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen. Our learning involved retelling the story in our play, joining in with the repeated refrains, learning some facts about bears and using clay to create bears of our own. Another popular story has been our focus text this week, 'What the Ladybird Heard on Holiday' by Julia Donaldson. Whilst discussing the story setting the children loved pointing out the familiar London landmarks they had learnt about and sharing their experiences of going to a zoo.



In Maths we have been learning about capacity and developing our understanding through play. We tested different containers and had fun filling and emptying them with oats or water. We have learnt to use words such as 'full', 'half full' and 'empty'.



This week the children showed how incredibly resilient and responsible they are as we began using our new learning environment. They were delighted to find lots of familiar resources and activities to continue exploring and playing with. The children were also so excited to see that Kit and Kai, our Kindness Elves, had flown their rocket to our classroom and left us a surprise letter too. Well done Nursery, you are all superstars!

RECEPTION

Last week in Reception we started with a visit to the HISN Art Exhibition in the hall. The children really enjoyed sculpting and moulding their clay and plasticine creations along with etching images in polystyrene to paint and print on paper.



Later on in the week, the Reception children also went on an exciting adventure to Carlisle Park. Everyone walked sensibly and safely to the park and had lots of fun on the playground rides. They sat on the swings and slid down the slides. They climbed the rope wall and jumped on the logs.



We also had a mini Sports day. Each of the teams were amazing and walked so carefully whilst balancing an egg on the spoon and were so fast as they jumped over hurdles and sprinted in relay race holding a baton. It was so fun and we all cheered each other along too!

This week, the children have been learning with lots of discussions around their transition into Year 1. The week started with a move up morning, where the children ventured into their new classroom to meet their new teacher. The Reception wing was buzzing with excitement and it was so lovely to see so many smiling faces as they passionately shared what they got up to.

YEAR 1

In year 1 we have been learning to describe the characters in Rapunzel using expanded noun phrases and conjunctions (e.g. and, because). We have also been describing fantasy settings, imagining that we were going on a journey to Rapunzel's tower.

Maths— we have been exploring money. The children have been ordering and adding coins together to make total value amounts. We have also compared coins and notes (e.g. how many one pound coins in 10 pounds).

This week we were very excited to have Safari Pete come in and teach us about a range of different animals, linking to our Science topic (Animals including humans). The children found out lots of new and interesting facts about amphibians, crocodiles, birds etc. and even got to hold some of the animals!




YEAR 2




In maths, we have consolidating our knowledge of measurement, measuring mass, capacity, length and temperature. We can use g, kg, ml, l, mm, cm, m and °C confidently now!

We are so excited for our new DT unit on Mechanisms where we will be building our own Jungle Jeeps on Explorer Day on the 15th July. This week we have been researching different vehicles and features before we make our own design



Year 2 have finished all their work on the Lonely Beast story. They planned and wrote

their own story where their own beast went on a journey to find the Lonely Beast. They worked so hard on their stories and we are so proud of what amazing writers they have become throughout Year 2.


