Reading & Phonics

We would like you to continue reading with your child five times a week and record this in their home school diary. The children will continue to read with an adult in school once a week, when their book will also be changed, and we will be assessing their progress continuously.

Phonics is way of teaching children to read and write and is taught daily in class. Children are taught the three essential skills of segmenting, blending and phoneme manipulation necessary for reading and spelling. At HISN we currently use **Sounds-Write** phonics programme from EYFS to Year 2 and beyond. Children are taught how to:

- Recognise the sounds that each individual letter makes
- Identify the sounds that different combinations of letters make e.g. ai, ow, oy
- Blend these sounds together from left to right to make a word

Computing and Science; skills and knowledge**Computing:**

- Computer skills – Click and drag with a mouse or trackpad; switch on and shutdown a computer independently; launch an application by double clicking it; log on and log off on a computer independently; manipulate an application window by moving and resizing it.

Science:

Key Year 1 Information:

Our topic this half term will be 'The World Outside Your Window!'

Throughout this term, the children will be studying seasonal changes and how these affect our weather, identifying similarities and differences between rural and urban settlements, and studying materials and their properties, making predictions and carrying out investigations to test our theories.

The children will take part in outdoor PE lessons twice a week. They should continue to come to school in their PE kit on the days they have PE. PE kit only should be worn on these days – please see uniform guidance on the website if you are unsure of what child should wear.

Key Information:

- Please label **everything**, including coats and shoes!
- If your child arrives after 9:00am they will need to go to the office to collect a late card. If pick up arrangements change during the day, please phone the school office no later than 2:30pm to let the admin team know who is going to be collecting your child. When the named person arrives, they will need to go the school office to pick up a collection card which gives the teacher permission to release the child.
- Please send your child to school with their book bag **every day** so they can change their book regularly.
- Please supply your child with a bottle of **water**, clearly labelled with their name. Please fill bottles with water rather than any other type of drink.
- Remember any messages for the day, e.g. a change in collection or a playdate, should be given to the member of staff in the playground from 8:50.
- As the weather gets colder and wetter, please ensure your child has the appropriate labelled clothing for both playtimes and outdoor PE sessions. Wellington boots should both be labelled and brought to school in a labelled plastic bag to hang on your child's peg.
