Dear Parent / Carer,

As part of our exciting topic 'Savages to Settlers', a study of Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age, we will be visiting Butser Ancient Farm on:

**Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> September 2021**

This is an excellent opportunity for the children to immerse themselves in Ancient British History and kick start their learning on this topic. The children will be participating in a range of workshops including:

- Stone Age archaeology
- Artefact handling
- Bronze Age pottery
- Clunching – Wall building using the ancient technique of clunching.

**Dates of visit:**

**Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> September 2021**

**Time:**

Pupils will need to arrive promptly at school at **8.15 am**. The coaches will leave at 8.30 am sharp. The children will return to school at approximately **4.30 pm** on both days. We will notify parents if they are running late by text.

**Cost:**

In order for this visit to take place, we will require a voluntary contribution of **£21 per child**. The payment should be made via Parent Pay no later than **Monday 26<sup>th</sup> September**. If you are in receipt of free school meals/pupil premium grant and you require support with this payment, please contact the office or Mr Tidd.

**Coach:**

The pupils will be travelling on two large coaches to and from Butser Farm.

**Activities:**

The pupils will take part in an array of outdoor activities including; clunching and excavation. All these activities will take place outside and therefore require appropriate clothing (see clothing section).

**Clothing:**

Due to the nature of the activities, we recommend wearing older clothes that you don't mind getting mucky.

Please ensure children have the following and are named clearly;

- a warm, water proof coat
- long trousers/leggings





- long sleeved jumper (layers advised)
- outdoor shoes/trainers/wellies
- gloves & hat
- A bag for mucky shoes and clean pair of shoes to wear on the return journey

### Packed lunch:

Please provide your child with a named small rucksack (the drawstring PE bag is fine) to carry their packed lunch, a snack and a named water bottle and change of shoes. Please do not include any fizzy drinks, sweets or nut products.
