DROP OF AND PICK UP

Please ensure children are dropped off and collected when the gates are open.

If your child is a late arrival bring them in to school via the office.

Children must not be left at the gate to walk to the office themselves, they must be accompanied by an adult; the adult must sign the child in on the school system located at the office reception

Please keep your child under your supervision during pick up and do not let children play on any playground equipment.





Safeguarding - Reporting a Concern


