A MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

Dear Parents/Carers

I am becoming concerned about the behaviour of some parents when dropping off and collecting children from the school. Some parents are dropping children off in the middle of the road which is a danger to the children, cyclists and other motorists. Recent incidents have occurred which have led to a cyclist and a pedestrian getting hurt. Also, parking in restricted areas is making crossing of roads difficult and dangerous as children cannot see the road clearly. I urge parents to be responsible when parking their cars and to find spaces which are legal i.e. not across a resident driveway or on restricted zones.



ABOUT US

Hello! We are the team that runs the Hygiene Bank project in the Hampton TW12 area. The Hygiene Bank is a people-powered charity that relies on local community volunteers like us.

Our aim is to tackle hygiene poverty by giving people in need access to hygiene basics - the everyday toiletries many of us take for granted.

WHAT IS HYGIENE POVERTY?

Hygiene poverty is not being able to afford everyday essential toiletries to keep clean. Imagine having to share your toothbrush or use washing up liquid to wash your body... The reality of low income is that it can leave people caught between being able to heat their homes, pay the rent, eat or stay clean.

HOW WE WORK



Toiletries are donated by the public via our local drop off locations. Brands and businesses also donate products.



STEP 2

A volunteer collects and sorts the toiletries and then allocates them to local charities and schools based on need.



STEP 3 Volunteers deliver the toiletries to the local charities and schools who then distribute these products to individuals and families living in hygiene poverty.


We all have a role to play in protecting children and young people from child abuse and neglect.

Many people do not act because they're worried about being wrong.

You don't have to be absolutely certain; if you're concerned a child is being abused or their safety is at risk, speak to someone.

Following these simple steps and reporting your concerns to your local council could provide the missing piece of information that is needed to keep a child safe.

Child abuse. If you think it, report it.



To spot the <u>signs of child abuse</u> <u>or neglect</u> look out for changes in these characteristics.

• **Appearance:** such as unusual injuries or consistently poor hygiene.

• **Behaviour:** such as being withdrawn, overly anxious, disruptive or self-harming or any other sudden changes in behaviour.

• **Communication:** such as talking aggressively, using sexual language or becoming secretive.



You have a number of options when it comes to reporting abuse anonymously. You can talk to:

Your <u>local council</u> is there to help resolve your worries by following these four simple steps;

- Listening to your concerns.
- Gathering information.
- Assessing the whole picture.
