




Nursery Weekly Newsletter – 6th January

Happy New Year to our Nursery families and a warm welcome back to an exciting term ahead. We hope you all had a restful and enjoyable Christmas break. Thank you all for your incredibly kind gifts and cards at the end of last term, they were so thoughtful and truly appreciated. It has been wonderful to see the children settling back into the Nursery routine this week and how excited they have been to see their friends and share their holiday news with us. In addition, the children were excited to discover our new classroom layout, explore with new resources and find that Kit and Kai, our Kindness Elves, have left their hot air balloon and are now flying in an aeroplane!

We will be supporting the children in:

- Managing our toileting needs independently
- Learning how to use our words to express our feelings and needs
- Developing our friendships across the Nursery
- Recapping rules and settling back in to routines in our classroom/garden
- Taking responsibility for our belongings and where things belong in our environment
- Learning how to use the Nursery resources and discovering through play and exploration
- Recognising their name independently
- Learning how to resolve conflicts
- Developing strategies to regulate their emotions



We are starting a new topic this term called 'The World Around Us'. As an introduction to the topic we will be reading 'Martha Maps it Out' by Leigh Hodgkinson. Martha loves drawing maps. She creates maps of everything - even her thoughts and dreams! Starting in outer space, we zoom in page by page, to our planet, Martha's community, and beyond to her dreams of a future where anything is possible.

We use the Zones of Regulation to help us to identify what we are feeling and ways in which we can handle our emotions. Please see the image for information about the coloured zones and the feelings they represent.

The ZONES of Regulation

Blue Zone Sad Bored Tired Sick	Green Zone Happy Focused Calm Proud	Yellow Zone Worried Frustrated Silly Excited	Red Zone overjoyed/Elated Panicked Angry Terrified



What is the name of our street? What local features are around us? For example Bushy Park, a library, a level crossing etc

Time to talk: We know how important talking at home is for exposing children to a wide range of vocabulary and ideas. This not only helps them with their reading and to become future writers, but also supports the children when expressing themselves. An idea this week is to talk about where you live and your local area.

Week beginning 9th January

- In maths we will be focusing on number and place value. We will be exploring number one and the different ways we can represent one such as with a dice, the numeral, our fingers, numicon and representing 1 on a five frame.
- In phonics we are continuing to work on our listening skills. We have been focusing on general sound discrimination and in particular tuning in to environmental sounds. Next week we will be going on a listening walk around our school and identifying what sounds we can hear around us.
- Expanding Our Vocabulary (EOV): Children's language development is a key area in our curriculum. We select key vocabulary linked to our learning and story focus to share with the children. For the next two weeks our words will be: map, street, numeral

Some important information and reminders:

- **Nursery PE:** We will be starting our PE lessons next week. Our PE day will be **every Tuesday**. Please ensure your child is wearing black tracksuit bottoms or leggings, their usual red polo top and black trainers. Please also be reminded that children should not be wearing any jewellery around their necks for safety reasons.



Missing Goldilocks and bears: Recently we have lost some brand new wooden toys from our story sack (please see the photo). We know toys can often accidentally end up in pockets whilst children are playing. If you happen to find a mummy bear, baby bear or Goldilocks at home we would be incredibly grateful if they could be returned to the Nursery. Thank you.

- **Reception Applications:** An important reminder that the deadline for the HSN Reception September 2023 applications is 15th January. If you wish for your children to continue their educational journey with HSN, please make sure that you have completed your application by this date.
- **Hand hygiene:** Please spend some time at home reinforcing the importance of hand hygiene with your child and modelling to them how to wash and dry their hands. In addition, please show your child how to cover their mouths when coughing and talk to them about using a tissue when sneezing.



Sensory/messy play resources: The children love sensory and messy play activities and we are often in need of ingredients. If you are happy to donate any of the following we would really appreciate it: water beads, salt, plain flour, vegetable oil, bicarbonate of soda, baking powder, shaving foam. Thank you.


- **Spare change of clothes:** We are running low on the spare clothes we have sent home when children have needed to be changed. Please ensure that they are washed and returned to us as soon as possible. We ask that you keep a spare change of clothes in your child's book bag at all times should we need to use them. Thank you.
- **Zips and gloves:** We have spent lots of time talking to the children about our bee rules recently and particularly about being responsible and believing in ourselves with a positive, 'can do' attitude. Please spend some time at home modelling to your child how to do up their zip on their coat and putting on gloves independently. Please encourage your child to take responsibility for their belongings and ensure all clothing is clearly labelled. Thank you.
- **Dropping off and collecting your child:** Please note the times for morning Nursery are 8.30-11.30 and afternoon Nursery times are 12.30-3.30. Please note the main gate will open at 12.30 for the afternoon session, please wait outside until then and do not buzz to come in before that time. Please ensure you arrive promptly and on time as arriving late is unsettling for the children. We ask that you drop your child off at the door and leave promptly afterwards. It can be distressing for children to see parents lingering or watching on. It is also overwhelming for children when lots of adults are standing in the walkway by the nursery door to the classroom. We thank you for your support and cooperation with this.

Things to bring to school:

- **Raincoat** - just a little reminder that your child should come to school with a **coat each day** as we are always out in the garden even if it is raining.
- **A pair of wellies** - we ask that each child bring a pair of wellies to school (labelled with their name) which will be left at Nursery so that during the wet months the children have appropriate footwear whilst in the garden.
- **Water bottle** - please make sure these are named and are filled with water only.
- **Red School Book bag** - please make sure these are named.
- **Spare change of clothes:** Please remember to send in a **labelled, spare change of clothes to be kept in your child's book bag**. Providing clothes from home ensures that your child feels more comfortable as the uniform/underwear belongs to them and fits them correctly should they need to be changed.
- **Labelling belongings:** Please be reminded to label **all** of your child's belongings including coats, cardigans, jumpers, hats and water bottles.

The children have already begun to benefit from the resources you have purchased and we are so incredibly grateful to you for supporting us in improving the children's learning experiences at school. - **Milk list:** At snack time, there is an option for your child to have milk free of charge. If you would like your child to be on the milk list, please go to the 'Cool Milk' website and register your child.
