HPP is an Attachment Aware School

Last year both schools worked with Achieving for Children (AfC) Virtual School and in collaboration with Educational Psychology Service to achieve an Attachment Aware Schools Award. This was a year long study programme which involved:

- -Training from AfC Virtual School
- -Coaching from a team of Educational Psychologists
- -On site Whole School Training in Attachment and Emotion Coaching
- -Development of a whole school change project based on findings from the Attachment Aware Schools Audit.

Attachment awareness in schools is about developing an ethos and school community which is attachment aware and able to provide a nurturing environment and positive relationships to promote secure attachments.

By developing an understanding of attachment theory, staff are able to apply this knowledge to their own practice for the benefit of all children; in particular those with attachment difficulties and other vulnerable learners.

This can help to improve attainment, behaviour and overall wellbeing for both children and staff. The emphasis is on the importance of understanding the emotional and learning needs of the children.

We are really proud of the award and wanted to share this achievement with the school community.



The Nursery children have had lots of fun during our first week at Nursery. The children have been busy exploring their new environment, getting to know one another and having lots of fun playing together. We are incredibly proud of how well the children are settling in so far and the independence they are developing. Thank you to our parents and careers for helping support us with transitioning the children as they get to know us and their new Nursery environment.











RECEPTION

It has been wonderful to have the children start full days this past week. Reception children have had a great time exploring their new environment and we are so proud of how well they are settling into school life. They are becoming much more familiar with their new routines and we have all been incredibly impressed .

We started the week with phonics, where the children have loved building words and we have been discussing the many feelings that we may have during the day and have learnt a very important message: all feelings are okay. We have also seen lots of excited faces around Reception as the children used the climbing frame for the first time with some very proud faces as they master the monkey bars and fireman's pole in the playground.





YEAR 1

We have been having a **SUPER** time in Year 1! From superheroes to superstars, the children have been doing some amazing pieces of descriptive writing based on our focus book '**Superkid**'. The teachers dressed up as various superheroes and the children interviewed them to find out what each of their super powers were.

The children have been amazing in Maths with their number skills, sorting and counting a variety of real-life objects, pictures, shapes and mathematical resources.

Science has seen the children continuing with their focus on the human body. The children enjoyed labelling the different parts of the body and studying the five senses, identifying the different things we can do with each sense.

In Art, we have been continuing with our theme of 'portraits'. The children have been creating images of themselves in the style of Pablo Picasso and Chris Ofilli, producing some super images of themselves and having great fun in the process!







Year 2 have been busy thinking about "A Place Called Home" when learning about countries, capital cities and different characteristics of the U.K. We loved sharing our ideas and seeing if we knew the countries' national flowers and landmarks.



We are beginning to master using adjectives and nouns to write expanded noun phrases in English, and are really excited to write our own Traction Man mission set in our very own classroom - watch this space!

We have been practising partitioning whole numbers into 2 parts in Maths and learning the different properties of materials in Science. We are excited to do our very first science investigation next week using different materials!

Dealing with Stress

Children can feel stressed, anxious and sad just the same as adults. Below is an example of an activity you can do with your child to help calm them.

How to make a stress sock

Fill an old sock with something soft—you could use bubble wrap, foam packaging, a washing up or shower sponge, rolled up sock or scrunched up wrapping paper—tie a knot in the top of the sock or use a hair bobble, to keep the contents inside. Squeeze and release the sock in a rhythm that feels right for you.


