We ask that you please continue to read with your child five times a week and record this in their home school diary. The children will continue to read with an adult in school once a week, when their book will be changed, and we will be assessing their progress continuously.

Phonics continues to be taught daily in class. During these lessons, children are taught the three essential skills of segmenting, blending and phoneme manipulation necessary for reading and spelling. The children are taught how to:

• Recognise the sounds that each individual letter makes;

identify the sounds that different combinations of letters make e.g. ai, ow, ov;

Blend these sounds together from left to right to make a word. •


