



The Curriculum

The following statement outlines the 'Curriculum Intent' for Hampton Primary Partnership and was composed in consultation with staff, governors and pupils. It reflects the Vision for Excellence in our curriculum.

'Be the best you can be' is at the heart of the HPP curriculum.

Across the partnership, we pride ourselves on our **progressive and vocabulary-rich** curriculum being **clear**, **carefully considered and connected**. This ensures that our children develop **key knowledge and skills** in a fun and inspiring way so that they are well-prepared for the next stage of their education.

Resilience and independence are embedded through the partnership's **ambitious** expectations for **all children to succeed**, whilst developing a life-long love for learning. By working in **partnership** with parents and carers, this supports our vision of **excellence** while considering all pupils' individual starting points and personal needs.

- You will also be invited to school celebrations throughout the year including class assemblies from Reception to Year 2.

Learning in the Early Years

At HISN we believe the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is a very important learning phase as it helps your child get ready for school as well as preparing them for their future learning and successes. From when your child is born up until the age of 5, their Early Years experience should be happy, active, exciting, fun and secure; and support their development, care and learning needs.

All EYFS settings must follow a legal document called the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework.

The EYFS Framework explains how and what your child will be learning to support their healthy development.

Your child will be learning skills, acquiring new knowledge and demonstrating their understanding through 7 areas of learning and development.

Children should mostly develop the 3 prime areas first. These are:

- Communication and language;
- Physical development; and
- Personal, social and emotional development.

These prime areas are those most essential for your child's healthy development and future learning.

As children develop, the prime areas will help them to develop skills in 4 specific areas. These are:

- Literacy;
- Mathematics;
- Understanding the world; and
- Expressive arts and design.

These 7 areas are used to plan your child's learning and activities. The professionals teaching and supporting your child will make sure that the activities are suited to your child's unique needs.

At HISN children in the EYFS learn by playing and exploring, being active, and through creative and critical thinking which takes place both indoors and outside.
