



Nursery Weekly Newsletter - 10th June

This week the children have been captivated by our focus story 'Clem and Crab' and have loved thinking about the beach using the help of some of our senses such as what we might see at the beach, what we might hear and what we might smell. The children have enjoyed sharing their experiences of going to the beach, making and selling ice creams using playdough and getting sandy in our beach small world play. We began talking about the importance of keeping our beaches clean and how we can all play our part too. They enjoyed the part of the story where Clem realised the crab was still in her pocket and on the bus with her. Next week the children will be helping to open their own beach shop and thinking about the items they may sell such as buckets and spades or fish and chips for example. They will be encouraged to help create signs and labels for the shop and have real coins to count and pay for their items.

Week beginning 13th June

- We will be continuing to explore our topic of 'Holidays'.
- In maths we will be working on weight and using language such as 'heavy', 'heavier than', 'light', 'lighter than' and 'balanced'.
- In phonics we will be learning about oral blending and segmenting. We will be modelling to the children how to blend orally and playing lots of games to support this. At home you may wish to model this too - for example when giving an instruction you could segment the last word into separate sounds and then blend them back together to say the word, "It's time to get your c-oa-t." It is very important to enunciate the sounds very clearly and not to add an 'uh' to some (e.g. 'sssssss' and not 'suh', 'mmmmmmm' and not 'muh'). - Our Expanding Our Vocabulary (EOV) words for this week are: heavy, light, balanced.
- The children will also experience the Digiwall next week as part of our PE provision.

We will be supporting the children in:

- Recapping rules and routines in our classroom/garden
- Taking responsibility for our belongings and where things belong in our environment
- Managing our toileting needs independently
- Learning how to use our words to express our feelings and needs
- Developing our friendships across the Nursery
- Recognising their name independently and learning how to write it
- Recognising numerals and different representations of numbers
- Learning how to resolve conflicts
- Developing strategies to regulate their emotions



We will be continuing with our story 'Clem and Crab' by Fiona Lumbers. Clem is an explorer, a collector, a protector of the seas! Whilst treasure hunting on her beloved beach, she stumbles across Crab, his claw stuck in a plastic bag. The book explores how little things we can all do to keep the beaches clean can make a huge difference to the environment. We will be continuing to explore the beach and how taking care of the beaches helps the sea life and our oceans.

What can we do to help look after our environment? How can we help and take responsibility?

Time to talk: An idea this week is for you to talk with your child about how we can help to look after the environments around us or our home and school.

Some important information and reminders:

- **School uniform:** Please be reminded that children should be sent to school in the correct school uniform and shoes. Crocs are not permitted nor is nail varnish or hoop earrings. Thank you for your cooperation with this.
- **Borrow a Book:** Books are to be returned **every Thursday** so that we can provide your child with a new book each Friday. We are finding it difficult to keep this running smoothly as children are not returning their books. Please ensure they are sent back into Nursery. Also a reminder to please ensure that your child does not put their water bottle into their book bag. A number of our books have returned wet or damaged. Please also encourage your child to handle their book with care. Thank you.
- **Rain coats:** Please ensure that your child comes to school with a raincoat each day. This can be a thin waterproof or pac-a-mac. The children spend a lot of time outdoors learning in the garden and therefore need a waterproof particularly as the weather can be incredibly unpredictable.
- **Sensory/messy play resources:** We are currently in need of **salt** and **vegetable oil** for making playdough. If you are happy to make any donations we would really appreciate it. Thank you.



- **Warm weather:** As the weather starts to improve we ask that every child brings a sunhat to school with them, preferably one which also covers their neck if possible. Please also apply sunscreen before the session. We spend lots of time out in the garden and want to ensure the children are protected in the sun. Please ensure their hat is clearly labelled. Please do not send sunglasses in as these can cause injuries should your child fall whilst running or playing. We would also like to remind you that children should bring a labelled bottle of water to Nursery every day, especially during the hotter days. Thank you for your support with this.
- **Parent Support:** Karen Finnegan is our wonderful family support advisor here at the school and has a wealth of knowledge and expertise in supporting families on a wide range of topics such as bereavement, toileting or behaviour at home to name a few. - **Labelling belongings:** Please be reminded to label all of your child's belongings including cardigans, jumpers, hats and water bottles. We often find that we have items with no name on them and this makes it difficult for us to return them to the correct home. We appreciate your support with this.


- **Spare change of clothes:** Please can **all parents send in a labelled, spare change of clothes to be kept in your child's book bag**. Unfortunately the spare clothes we have at school are not being returned and therefore when a child needs changing we do not have the right clothing for them. Providing clothes from home also ensures that the child feels more comfortable as the uniform/underwear actually belongs to them and fits them correctly. Please speak to a member of the Nursery team if needed.

Change of Pick Up:

- Please ensure that you email the office and also speak to a member of the Nursery team if your child is being collected by a different adult or going home with another child. This also applies if your child needs to be collected early from school.
- We also ask that you ensure the person collecting is old enough to be collecting a child from school.
- The children's safety is paramount to us so a member of staff may ask who someone is if we do not recognise them.



- Please keep an eye out for your child when they are dismissed and come to greet them when they leave the Nursery premises. Thank you for your support and cooperation with this.
- **PE:** Just a reminder that our Nursery PE sessions are every Tuesday. Please ensure your child is wearing trainers and the appropriate clothing for PE.



Play in the Nursery: Play is a fundamental part of our approach to Early Years here at Hampton Infant School and Nursery. We offer the children opportunities to explore, get messy, make, create, move, discover, experiment, talk and more. Our mud kitchen, sand and water provision are popular places in our Nursery and offer a huge range of learning opportunities. Your child's clothing may get wet, dirty or a little messy in the process of learning but it helps to show you what your child has been engaged with and learning whilst at Nursery. We thank you for your support and understanding in this.

- **Junk modelling materials:** If you have any of the following junk items we would love to make use of them in the Nursery and recycle them into wonderful models.
 - kitchen roll tubes
 - tin foil boxes
 - toothpaste tubes
 - shoe boxes
 - any other cardboard container (except food packaging)

Please note that we are unable to take any food boxes or wrappers.

- **End of the day pick up** - We ask that when you are collecting your child you wait along the wall beside the Nursery gate and then move over to the railings when the child you are collecting has been called so that they can clearly see the adult picking them up. This helps us to ensure that the end of session dismissal runs smoothly and the children find their adult with ease.

Please ensure you drop your child off on time at the start of the Nursery session as this is key to helping them settle for the morning/afternoon and is important when helping your child adapt to the Nursery routines.

Things to bring to school:

- **A pair of wellies** - we ask that each child bring a pair of wellies to school (labelled with their name) which will be left at Nursery so that during the wet months the children have appropriate footwear whilst in the garden.
- **Water bottles** - please make sure these are named and are filled with water instead of juice. We ask that the children do not put these into their book bags as they may damage any letters, pictures or books which may be inside.
- **Raincoat** - just a little reminder that your child comes to school with a coat, (even if it is a pac-a-mac!).
- **Red School Book bag**

Please ensure all items listed above are clearly labelled
