Be respectful towards yourself, others and the school environment


Be hard working and challenge yourself

Our Behaviour Chart System


What happens when we show positive behaviour?

We move our names up until we reach the 'pot of gold' and receive a special sticker. We can earn additional stickers from adults and the certificate of excellence for demonstrating our school principals in our weekly celebration assemblies.



What happens when we show negative behaviour?

If we make negative choices, we are first given a verbal warning to remind us of expectations. If this continues, we are on an official warning and move our name to the 'cloud'. If the behaviour continues, we spend 5 minutes of playtime reflecting with an adult. If the behaviour still does not improve, name is



moved to the 'thunder cloud' and spend time with a member of the senior leadership team.
